Lesson Text: Hebrews 6:1-9; Hebrews 10:19-39

- I. Nadab and Abihu – Aaron’s Sons.
- A. Who were they? Ex. 6:23
1. Abihu means he is my father.
  2. Nadab means liberal, willing.
  3. Their mother’s name was Elisheba (Oath of the Lord). She was a princess of the royal tribe of Judah. Num. 2:3
  4. Her brother Nahshon, was head of the tribe of Judah. Num. 1:7; 2:3; 7:10-17
- II. Their Spiritual Experiences.
- A. The Holy Spirit. Heb. 6:4-5  
Num. 11:16-17; 24-30; Ex. 18:13-27
1. Nadab and Abihu were among the seventy who were commissioned by God. (v. 16)
  2. They were anointed by the Holy Spirit. (v. 17)
  3. Moses had a great anointing of the Holy Spirit. Part of the power was taken from him, by the Lord, to be divided and used to anoint 70 others. (v. 25)
- B. They Saw The God of Israel. Ex. 24:1; 9-11
1. Seeing God points to those who were once enlightened. (v. 10)
  2. Did eat and drink points to those who have partook of the Holy Ghost and have tasted the good word of God. (v. 11); Heb. 6:4-5
- C. They Prophesied. Num. 11:25-30  
(v. 25); Heb. 6:4-5
1. They tasted of the heavenly gift and of the powers of the world to come.
  2. Their anointing was to judge and govern. This explains why they only prophesied this one time.
- D. Priestly Attire. Ex. 28; 29
1. They wore holy garments for glory and beauty.
  2. The garments were colorful as emblems of the glory and the beauty of God whom the priests represented.
- III. Divine Presence. Ex. 33:18-23;  
Lev. 9:23-24
- A. Along With Everyone Else, They Saw The Glory Of The Lord Appear. (v. 23)
- B. For The First Time Ever, Fire Came From Heaven And Lit The Brazen Altar. (v. 24)
- C. The People Responded As A Result Of The Sudden Appearance Of God And Of The Consuming Fire. (v. 24)
- IV. Violated. Lev. 10:1
- A. Offered Fire And Was Not Told To Do So.
- B. Offered Incense At The Wrong Time And Place.
- C. Fail To Sanctify Themselves Before Jehovah And The People.
- D. Were Carrying On In A Drunken State.
- V. Modern Day Warning. Heb. 6:1-6  
Heb. 6:4
- A. To Whom?
1. Those who are enlightened.
  2. They have tasted of the heavenly gift.
  3. Have been made partakers of the Holy Ghost.
  4. Have tasted the good word of God.
  5. Have tasted the power of the world to come.
- B. We Must Not Sin Willfully. Heb. 10:26-39  
(v. 26)  
(v. 26)
1. After having received the knowledge of the truth.
  2. Renounce Christ as the only sacrifice after we have received him.
  3. Despise the gospel after we receive it.
  4. Tread under foot the son of God after knowing him.
  5. Count Christ blood an unholy thing.
  6. Despise or blaspheme the Holy Ghost.
  7. Become an adversary after knowing the truth.
- C. Fall Into The Hands of The Living God. Heb. 10:31  
Heb. 10:19-25; 32-39
1. How not to do this.
    - (a) Draw near with a true heart. (Compare this to Abihu and Nadab). (v. 22)
    - (b) Hold fast the profession of our faith. (v. 23)
    - (c) Provoke one another to love and good works. (v. 24)
    - (d) Do not forsake the assembling of ourselves together. (v. 25)
    - (e) Call to remember. (v. 32)
    - (f) Cast not away therefore your confidence. (v. 35)
    - (g) Pray for patience. (v. 36)
    - (h) Do not draw back (v. 38)
