- I. Two Ways God Speaks To The Hebrews.
- A. In Divers manners to the prophets. Heb. 1:1
- B. In That Day and Time By His Son Jesus.
1. This statement was very needful. The weak Hebrew saints had no problem believing that God spoke by the prophets, but they did have some misunderstanding about Him coming in the flesh and being divine. Heb. 2:16-18; 5:7-8; 4:14-16
- II. The Father Made Jesus Heir of All Things.
- A. The Worlds -- The Ages of Time. The Earth and The Heavens. The Universe. Heb. 1:2
- B. In The Beginning He Laid The Foundation of The Earth and The Heavens. They Are The Works of His Hands. Heb. 1:10
1. They were created by Christ Jesus at the Father's wishes.
2. They shall perish, this means they shall be changed, not annihilated. Heb. 1:11, 12; II Pet. 3:5-10
3. The earth is very old and show the signs of it. Christ is immortal and his years never fail. Heb. 1:12
- III. Three Things About The Son. Heb. 1:3
- A. He Was The Brightness (Reflection) of The Father's Glory, Express Image of The Father's Person. Deity In Body, Soul and Spirit.
1. These words describe the likeness of Jesus to His father.
- B. His Power Before He Came To Earth.
1. He spoke and things came into existence.
2. He upholds all things by His power. All things pertaining to nature, the earth, and the universe. Heb. 1:2; Jn. 1:1-3; Gen. 1
- C. He Purged Our Sins.
1. Offered himself as a sacrifice. Heb. 9:11-13, 22-24
2. All things by the law was purged by blood. Heb. 9:11-13
3. It was necessary that things in heaven be purified by blood. Heb. 9:22
4. Therefore, Christ entered into heaven into the Holy Place of the great temple to appear in the presence of God for us with His own blood to put away sin. Heb. 9:23
5. Jesus, immediately after His resurrection, went to heaven to do this. Heb. 9:24
6. Sat down, means his redemptive work on earth was finished. Jn. 20:11-17
Jn. 19:30
- IV. Paul Compares Angels With Jesus.
- A. Angels Are Created Ministering Spirits and Flames of Fire. (they have power). Heb. 1:7
1. They are sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation. This implies that angels help them in any ways needed. Heb. 1:14
- B. The Son God Said:
1. I have begotten thee (not created). Heb. 1:5; Mt. 1:20-21
2. I will be to Him a father and He will be to me a son. Ps. 2:7; II Sam. 7:14
3. Let all the angels worship Him. Heb 1:6; Lu. 2:10-14
4. Unto the Son He saith, your throne O God is forever and ever.
5. Sceptre (Heb. shebet) an ornamental rod or staff used as a symbol of sovereignty and power. Ps. 45:6
6. Because of His complete obedience while on earth, God anointed Him with the oil of exultant joy and gladness above and beyond his companions. Ps. 45:7
